TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Subjects are taken and payment is made for a whole semester (2 terms).
2. Tutors provide a minimum of 14 lessons during each semester.
3. Fees are payable in full, prior to the commencement of each semester.
4. Cheques must be made payable to the tutor. A receipt will be issued upon request.
5. Fees are non-refundable except where the subject is withdrawn by the individual tutor.
6. Where a child is absent from the school, the lesson is forfeited. The lesson will, however, be made up if the tutor is absent. Prior day's notice of absence is appreciated.
7. 24 hours notice is required if a child will be absent for any reason including school activities.
8. A full term's notice in writing must be given prior to withdrawal from private tuition. Insufficient notice will necessitate payment of term's fees. No refunds will be given for the remainder or part of the term where insufficient notice is given.
9. Enrolments will be processed by the tutors in order of receipt of application forms. Where the number of application exceeds the number of places available, allocation will be made at the tutor's discretion. Initially priority will be given to continuing students, but otherwise, places will be allocated on the basis of the receipt of application.
10. Fees for Curtain Call will be charged by the school directly to the student's term account each semester.

CLAREMONT COLLEGE DRAMATIC ARTS

Drama classes are a fun, engaging and interactive way for children to develop valuable life skills such as confidence in public speaking and performing in front of others, problem solving, self esteem and the ability to work in a team that supports each other's academic and creative ideas. Drama not only encourages students to work in small groups but also encourages students to meet personal and individual learning needs.

GROUP DRAMA LESSONS

 **\$280 per Semester x 16 lessons**

Group Drama classes encourage knowledge, skill and understanding in creating playbuilt works, performing for an audience and reflecting on their own dramatic works and those of others. Students learn to collaborate with peers, build self confidence, develop problem solving abilities and enlarge their capacity for public speaking in a stimulating, supportive and fun environment.

Topics such as Theatre Sports and Improvisation, Mask work, Role and Character Development, Group Devising, Vocal and Breathing Capacity, Clowning, Screen Acting, Circus Drama, Scripted and Playbuilt performances, Physical Theatre and many more will be taught throughout the year.

Students have many opportunities to showcase their knowledge and skill in performances for family and friends across the year.

PRIVATE DRAMA LESSONS

 **\$520 per Semester x 14 lessons**

Private Drama lessons solidify knowledge and skill from group lessons with a greater focus on student-teacher relationship and attention to detail. Whilst group lessons have individual student goal setting and learning needs designed for each student, private lessons enables the learner to obtain even greater attention and guided learning.

Private lessons aim to give support to students looking to apply dramatic skills in public speaking, connecting to images and texts for greater believability, body language and vocal expression in poetry, monologues, cold readings and more.

Private lessons are suitable for those already involved in group drama and wish to build their skill further or for those students who feel the support of a private lesson would better suit their learning needs.


